Dear Shareholder

Annual General Meeting

I am pleased to enclose the Company's Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2014. This year's Annual General Meeting will be held on Thursday 30 April 2015 at 11.00 am at the Manor of Groves Hotel, High Wych, Sawbridgeworth, Hertfordshire, CM21 0JU. Notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out at the end of this document.

An explanation of the business to be considered at the meeting is set out below.

To receive the annual report and accounts (Resolution 1)

The Directors' report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014 will be presented.

Directors' Remuneration (Resolution 2)

Resolutions 2 deals with Directors' remuneration and seeks shareholder approval for the Directors' Annual Report on Remuneration.

The Annual Report on Remuneration can be found on pages 33 to 45 (inclusive) in the annual report & accounts and the vote on it is advisory and will not affect the way in which the pay policy has been implemented.

Final Dividends (Resolutions 3 and 4)

A final ordinary dividend of 4.8 pence per share and a special dividend of 7.8 pence per share for the year ended 31 December 2014 are recommended for payment by the directors.

Re-election of Directors (Resolutions 5-11) and Election of Directors (Resolutions 12 and 13)

Resolutions 5 to 11 inclusive deal with the re-election of Directors in accordance with the requirements of the UK Corporate Governance Code.

Resolution 5 deals with the re-election of Mr D C Blackwood who serves as an Executive Director of the Company. Resolutions 6 to 10 inclusive deal with the re-election of the Hon. A G Catto, Mr J Chen, Dato' Lee Hau Hian, Dr J J C Jansz and Mr B W D Connolly respectively who serve as Non-executive Directors of the Company. Your Non-executive Directors bring a wide diversity of skills and relevant business and boardroom experience gained from past and current involvement with a number of companies and areas of commerce. I can confirm that, following formal performance evaluation, the performance of each of them continues to be effective and to demonstrate commitment to the role of Non-executive Director of the Company.

Resolution 11 deals with my re-election.

Resolutions 12 and 13 deal with the election of Mr C G MacLean and Mrs C A Johnstone who have joined the Board since the 2014 Annual General Meeting as an Executive Director and as a Non-executive Director respectively.

The following biographical details are provided in order for you to take an informed decision on the re-election/election of the above named.

Mr D C Blackwood joined the Board in October 2007 and is Chief Financial Officer. He holds a Bachelor of Science (Mathematics) degree from the University of Durham and is a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales and a Fellow of the Association of Corporate Treasurers. During a long career at ICI he held a number of senior finance roles including Group Financial Controller and Group Treasurer. Age 56.

The Hon. A G Catto joined the Board as a Non-executive Director in 1981. He is Managing Director of CairnSea Investments Limited which has a number of investments in early stage companies. Prior to the establishment of CairnSea he was a director of Morgan Grenfell & Co Ltd and then Lazard Brothers & Co Ltd. His current other directorships include Neptune Investment Management Limited. The Hon. A G Catto is a grandson of the first Lord Catto, the founder of the company that became Yule Catto & Co plc and has subsequently been renamed Synthomer plc. Age 62.

Mr J Chen joined the Board in October 2012 and is considered to be an independent Non-executive Director. After practising as a US attorney and then spending 12 years in a series of legal and operational roles at General Motors and Delphi Corporation in China he joined Alcoa in 2007 where he is now a corporate Vice President based in Shanghai. He is a board member of China Zhong Nan University. Age 62.

Dato' Lee Hau Hian is Malaysian and joined the Board as a Non-executive Director in 1993. He stood down in 2000 to become an Alternate Director and re-joined the Board in 2002. He is the Managing Director of Batu Kawan Berhad, a listed Malaysian investments holding company, with interests in plantations and chemicals manufacturing. He is a Director of Kuala Lumpur Kepong Berhad and is the President of the Perak Chinese Maternity Association. He also serves as a Director of Yayasan De La Salle. Age 61.

Dr J J C Jansz joined the Board in April 2012 and is considered to be an independent Non-executive Director. He is founder and managing director of Expertise Beyond Borders BV, an independent business and technology management consultancy. He also serves as independent Non-executive Director at Genomatica (US) and is a member of the Sipchem R&D Centre Advisory Board (Saudi Arabia). He is a Senior Advisor at Natrium Capital (UK) and Siluria Technologies (US). Until 2010 he was President, Technology Business and a member of the management team of LyondellBasell. Age 58.

Mr B W D Connolly joined the Board in January 2014 and is considered to be an independent Non-executive Director. Until June 2013 he was a senior executive at Intertek Group PLC and had previously been Chief Executive Officer of Moody International (which was acquired by Intertek in 2011). Prior to Moody, he was managing director of Atos Origin UK, and spent more than 25 years of his career with Schlumberger in senior international roles over three continents. He is an independent non-executive director and chairman of the remuneration committee at Cape plc. He is also chairman of two private equity backed companies. Age 58.

Mr N A Johnson. I joined the Board in September 2011 and have been Chairman of the Board since May 2012. I held senior executive positions at British Aerospace and in the UK motor manufacturing industry before becoming Chief Executive of RAC Holdings from 1995-1999. I am chairman of Motability Operations Group plc and e2v plc and the Senior Independent Non-executive Director of the Business Growth Fund. Age 65.

Mr C G MacLean joined the Company and was appointed to the Board as Chief Executive Officer in January 2015. He holds a Bachelor of Science (Chemistry) degree from Aberdeen University. He was previously at INEOS where he held a number of senior roles since 1998, most recently as a board director of INEOS Group and Chairman of Styrolution and Petroineos. Age 51.

Mrs C A Johnstone joined the Board on 20 March 2015 and is considered to be an independent Non-executive Director. She was a partner at PricewaterhouseCoopers until 2009 having worked extensively with large global organisations on turnaround strategy, mergers and acquisitions and cost reduction programmes. She is currently deputy chair, non-executive director and chair of the audit committee of Leeds Teaching Hospital Trust, an independent member of the audit committee of the Crown Prosecution Service, England and Wales and a member of the governing council of the University of Leeds. Age 54.

Re-appointment of auditor and auditor's remuneration (Resolutions 14 and 15)

Resolution 14 relates to the re-appointment of PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP as auditor who were appointed by the Board in July 2012 and Resolution 15 authorises the directors to set the auditor's remuneration.

In addition to the above routine business normally conducted at the Annual General Meeting it is proposed to seek shareholders' approval for the following:

Authority to allot shares (Resolution 16)

Resolution 16, which is proposed as an ordinary resolution, gives the Directors a new authority to allot shares under the provisions of the Articles of Association. This authority replaces all previous authorities. The maximum amount of the relevant securities that the Directors will have authority to allot is £11,329,358 which is one third of the nominal amount of the total issued share capital of the Company as at 13 March 2015. The Directors have no present intention of exercising this authority which will lapse on the earlier of the date of the 2016 Annual General Meeting and 30 June 2016.

Authority to disapply pre-emption rights (Resolution 17)

Under the Companies Act 2006 the Directors may only allot shares for cash otherwise than to existing shareholders pro rata to their holdings if so authorised by the shareholders in general meeting. Resolution 17, which is proposed as a Special Resolution, gives authority to the Directors to allot and issue ordinary shares which they will be authorised to allot, pursuant to the authority conferred by Resolution 16 for cash, as though the pre-emption rights contained in Section 561 of the Companies Act 2006 did not apply to such allotment and issue, in respect of issues in favour of ordinary shareholders and otherwise generally up to an aggregate nominal value of £1,699,403. This amount is equal to 5% of the nominal amount of the total issued share capital of the Company as at 13 March 2015.

Authority to purchase own shares (Resolution 18)

The effect of Resolution 18, which is proposed as a Special Resolution, if duly passed will be to renew the general authority of the Company to make market purchases of its own ordinary shares. The maximum number of ordinary shares which may be purchased is 33,988,076 (representing 10% of the Company's issued ordinary share capital as at 13 March 2015) at a minimum price of 10p and a maximum price of 105% of the average of the closing middle market quotations of the Company's ordinary shares as derived from the London Stock Exchange Daily Official List for the five business days immediately preceding the day on which such share is contracted to be purchased (exclusive of expenses).

The Directors have no specific intention of using this authority and the authority will only be exercised if the Directors believe that to do so would result in an increase in earnings per share and would be in the best interests of the Company's shareholders generally.

Holding of general meetings at 14 days' notice (Resolution 19)

The effect of Resolution 19, which is proposed as a Special Resolution, if duly passed, is to approve 14 days as the minimum period of notice for all general meetings of the Company other than AGMs. The approval will be effective until the Company's next AGM, when it is intended that the approval be renewed. The Company will use this notice period when permitted to do so in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and when the Directors consider that it is appropriate to do so.

Voting arrangements

May I draw to your attention that the Company includes a "vote withheld" option on the Proxy Form in order to reflect clearly the views of those shareholders who wish to abstain from voting on a particular resolution. You should note however, that a "vote withheld" is not a vote in law and will not be counted in the calculation of the votes "For" or "Against" a resolution.

Meeting, action to be taken and available information

The Resolutions, to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held on Thursday 30 April 2015, are set out in the Notice of Meeting at the end of this document. Your Directors believe that these proposals are in your best interests and those of the Company and recommend you to vote in favour of them. Your Directors intend to vote in favour of the resolutions in respect of their own beneficial holdings, which amount to 2,049,631 ordinary shares, representing 0.6% of the issued ordinary share capital.

To be valid any proxy form or other instrument appointing a proxy must be received by post or (during normal business hours only) by hand at Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol, BS99 6ZY or at the electronic address provided in the proxy form, in each case no later than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or any adjourned meeting. The return of a completed proxy form, other such instrument or any CREST Proxy Instruction (as described in paragraph 9 of the notes to the Notice of Meeting) will not prevent a shareholder attending the Annual General Meeting and voting in person if he/she wishes to do so.

The terms of appointment and service contracts of the Directors will be available for inspection at the place of the Annual General Meeting noted above from 15 minutes before the Annual General meeting until its end.

Special business

16. To resolve that the authority conferred on the Directors by Article 5.2 of the Company's Articles of Association be renewed for the period ending at the end of the Annual General Meeting in 2016 or on 30 June 2016, whichever is the earlier, and for such period the Section 551 Amount shall be £11,329,358. Such authority shall be in substitution for all previous authorities pursuant to Section 551 of the Companies Act 2006.
17. To resolve that subject to the passing of Resolution 16 above, the power conferred on the Directors by Article 5.3 of the Company's Articles be renewed for the period referred to in such Resolution and for such period the Section 561 Amount shall be £1,699,403. Such authority shall be in substitution for all previous powers pursuant to Section 561 of the Companies Act 2006.
18. That the Company be unconditionally and generally authorised for the purpose of Section 701 of the Companies Act 2006 ('the Act') to make market purchases (as defined in Section 693(4) of the Act) of ordinary shares of 10p each in the capital of the Company provided that:
 - a) the maximum number of shares which may be purchased is 33,988,076;
 - b) the minimum price which may be paid for each share is 10p (exclusive of expenses);
 - c) the maximum price which may be paid for a share is an amount equal to 105% of the average of the closing middle market quotations of the Company's ordinary shares as derived from the London Stock Exchange Daily Official List for the five business days immediately preceding the day on which such share is contracted to be purchased (exclusive of expenses); and
 - d) this authority shall expire at the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company or, if earlier, 15 months after the passing of this Resolution (except in relation to the purchase of shares the contract for which was concluded before the expiry of such authority and which might be executed wholly or partly after such expiry) unless such authority is renewed prior to such time.

Notes to the Notice of Meeting

1. Members are entitled to appoint a proxy to exercise all or any of their rights to attend and to speak and vote on their behalf at the meeting. A shareholder may appoint more than one proxy in relation to the Annual General Meeting provided that each proxy is appointed to exercise the rights attached to a different share or shares held by that shareholder. A proxy need not be a shareholder of the Company. A proxy form which may be used to make such appointment and give proxy instructions accompanies this notice.
2. To be valid any proxy form or other instrument appointing a proxy must be received by post or (during normal business hours only) by hand at Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol, BS99 6ZY or at the electronic address provided in the proxy form, in each case no later than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or any adjourned meeting.
3. The return of a completed proxy form, other such instrument or any CREST Proxy Instruction (as described in paragraph 9 below) will not prevent a shareholder attending the Annual General Meeting and voting in person if he/she wishes to do so.
4. Any person to whom this notice is sent who is a person nominated under Section 146 of the Companies Act 2006 to enjoy information rights (a 'Nominated Person') may, under an agreement between him/her and the shareholder by whom he/she was nominated, have a right to be appointed (or to have someone else appointed) as a proxy for the Annual General Meeting. If a Nominated Person has no such proxy appointment right or does not wish to exercise it, he/she may, under any such agreement, have a right to give instructions to the shareholder as to the exercise of voting rights.
5. The statement of the rights of shareholders in relation to the appointment of proxies in paragraphs 1 and 2 above does not apply to Nominated Persons. The rights described in these paragraphs can only be exercised by shareholders of the Company.
6. To be entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting (and for the purpose of the determination by the Company of the votes they may cast), Shareholders must be registered in the Register of Members of the Company at close of business on Tuesday 28 April 2015 (or, in the event of any adjournment, on the date which is two days before the time of the adjourned meeting). Changes to the Register of Members after the relevant deadline shall be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend and vote at the meeting.
7. The Company's capital consists of 339,880,769 ordinary shares with voting rights.
8. CREST members who wish to appoint a proxy or proxies through the CREST electronic proxy appointment service may do so by using the procedures described in the CREST Manual. CREST Personal Members or other CREST sponsored members, and those CREST members who have appointed a service provider(s), should refer to their CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s), who will be able to take the appropriate action on their behalf.
9. In order for a proxy appointment or instruction made using the CREST service to be valid, the appropriate CREST message (a 'CREST Proxy Instruction') must be properly authenticated in accordance with Euroclear UK & Ireland Limited's specifications, and must contain the information required for such instruction, as described in the CREST Manual (available via www.euroclear.com/CREST). The message, regardless of whether it constitutes the appointment of a proxy or is an amendment to the instruction given to a previously appointed proxy must, in order to be valid, be transmitted so as to be received by the issuer's agent (ID 3RA50) by the latest time(s) for the receipt of proxy appointments specified in Note 2. For this purpose, the time of receipt will be taken to be the time (as determined by the time stamp applied to the message by the CREST Application Host) from which the issuer's agent is able to retrieve the message by enquiry to CREST in the manner prescribed by CREST. After this time any change of instructions to proxies appointed through CREST should be communicated to the appointee through other means.
10. CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service providers should note that Euroclear UK & Ireland Limited does not make available special procedures in CREST for any particular message. Normal system timings and limitations will, therefore, apply in relation to the input of CREST Proxy Instructions. It is the responsibility of the CREST member concerned to take (or, if the CREST member is a CREST personal member, or sponsored member, or has appointed a voting service provider, to procure that his CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s) take(s)) such action as shall be necessary to ensure that a message is transmitted by means of the CREST system by any particular time. In this connection, CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting system providers are referred, in particular, to those sections of the CREST Manual concerning practical limitations of the CREST system and timings.
11. The Company may treat as invalid a CREST Proxy Instruction in the circumstances set out in Regulation 35(5)(a) of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001.
12. Any corporation which is a member can appoint one or more corporate representatives who may exercise on its behalf all of its powers as a member provided that they do not do so in relation to the same shares.
13. Under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006 members meeting the threshold requirements set out in that Section have the right to require the Company to publish on a website a statement setting out any matter relating to:
 - (i) the audit of the Company's accounts (including the auditor's report and the conduct of the audit) that are to be laid before the Annual General Meeting; or
 - (ii) any circumstance connected with an auditor of the Company ceasing to hold office since the previous meeting at which annual accounts and reports were laid in accordance with Section 437 of the Companies Act 2006. The Company may not require the shareholders requesting any such website publication to pay its expenses in complying with Sections 527 or 528 of the Companies Act 2006. Where the Company is required to place a statement on a website under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006, it must forward the statement to the Company's auditor not later than the time when it makes the statement available on the website. The business which may be dealt with at the Annual General Meeting includes any statement that the Company has been required under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006 to publish on a website.

Notes to the Notice of Meeting continued

14. Any member attending the meeting has the right to ask questions. The Company must cause to be answered any such question relating to the business being dealt with at the meeting but no such answer need be given if (a) to do so would interfere unduly with the preparation for the meeting or involve the disclosure of confidential information, (b) the answer has already been given on a website in the form of an answer to a question, or (c) it is undesirable in the interests of the Company or the good order of the meeting that the question be answered.
15. There have been no movements in the interests of the directors in the share capital of the Company as disclosed on page 42 of the 2014 Annual Report during the period from 31 December 2014 to 13 March 2015 other than:
 - Mr C G MacLean was awarded a nil cost option over 231,726 ordinary shares of 10p each in the Company on 27 February 2015.
 - Mr D C Blackwood was awarded a nil cost option over 127,452 ordinary shares of 10p each in the Company on 27 February 2015.
16. Further to the disclosure of investor interests on page 47 of the 2014 Annual Report, the following investor interests have been notified to the Company under Section 5 of the Disclosure and Transparency Rules of the UK Listing Authority during the period from 13 February 2015 to 13 March 2015:
